

Hinckley Lion's Club HBR Scholarship Program

The Hinckley Lion's Club will present to a graduating HBR High School senior a scholarship for tuition only payable to any community college, trade school, union or apprentice program of the recipient's choice. The first scholarship was awarded to a graduating senior of the class of 2005.

This scholarship will be awarded annually and renewable for a second year in the amount of \$_____ for each year. (Dollar amount to be set annually in the fall by the Hinckley Lions Club). This scholarship will be paid per semester in advance with the first semester being paid without any documentation of proof of grades and all continuing payments to be paid with the student maintaining an equivalent of a C average or higher. Each awarded scholarship will expire after two years from the student's date of high school graduation regardless if they have used up the full amount. If the student elects a program that finishes in less than two years the equivalent of the two-year dollar amount will be presented with acceptable grades. The awarded recipient will be required to sign a privacy of information release allowing the Lions Club to information from the school regarding their finances and grades.

The application must be typed or computer generated. Handwritten applications will be rejected. The application format should be questions followed by the answers. Part I should be on a separate sheet from Part II. The second year's scholarship application will be without Part II however the student will be required to provide a transcript of grades and willing to sign all privacy statements needed to release such information to the Hinckley Lions Club or any assigned representative of the club.

Children of a Hinckley Lions member will be eligible for this scholarship.

This scholarship is based on the information provided in Part II.

Part I: (Seen only by the school)

1. Name, Address, and Phone Number.
2. Name of Parents / Guardians.

Part II:

1. Tell us about your activities in which you actively participated while in high school. Note the offices held and honors received.
2. Tell us about any activities, honors, awards, or offices you have held outside of school, which you believe, have benefited your community.
3. What hobbies or special interests do you have?
4. What jobs have you held?
5. In what ways have you prepared financially to further your education?
6. What do you plan to study and what are your career plans?
7. Where do you plan to further your education?
8. Why do you feel the Hinckley Lion's Club should award you a scholarship?

Hinckley Lion's Club Scholarship Guidelines and Procedures.

These are the guidelines and procedures that should be followed in the administering and selection of a Hinckley Big Rock (HBR) high school senior for the Hinckley Lion's Scholarship. Any HBR senior is eligible rather they are a resident of Hinckley or Big Rock.

HBR high school guidance counselor.

1. Will post an announcement of scholarship availability at the high school in the fall.
2. Will collect all scholarship applications until entry deadline.
3. Will keep original application and will make copies of Part II for the selection committee. The intent is to keep the identity of the applicants anonymous to the selection committee until such time that the applications have been judged and rank ordered.

Hinckley Lion's Club selection committee.

1. The selection committee will be appointed by the standing club President each year.
2. The club will judge our selection with the following criteria in mind:
 - a. Volunteer activity and community service
 - b. Volunteer activity within the school
 - c. Academics
 - d. Career choices
 - e. Need
3. The committee will judge all applications and rank order by consensus.
4. It is the intent of the Hinckley Lion's Club to award this scholarship to a good, well-rounded student who has given of their time to their community in the true sense of volunteerism.
5. The amount will be set annually in the fall by the Club President or his assign in an amount equal to (1) one year tuition for a full time student to receive the minimum requirement hours to obtain an Associates Degree at Wabaunsee Community College. The second year renewable scholarship will be in an amount equal to the first year regardless of any changes in pricing at the college. (e.g. 2005 minimum hours required 64 x \$55 credit hour = \$3,520 total or \$1,760 per year). Maximum scholarship award will be limited to \$4,000.00.
